WSU SPECIFIC FEE TYPES

Services and Activities Fee (S&A Fees)

Charged to all students and used to support nonacademic student activities and programs. Student fees are used to enrich the student experience through funding for student government, entertainment, student organizations, speakers, facilities, and recreation.

Mandatory Fees

Other fees such as the CUB Fee, Student Recreation Center Fee, Stadium Fee, Transit Fee, Technology Fee, and Chinook Fee were directly approved by the student body through a referendum vote. The Health Fee did not go through a referendum vote, instead was brought directly to the Board of Regents for approval. Mandatory fees are charged to all students.

Fee for Service

Some fees have two components where certain basic services are included and additional services have additional fees associated with them. Examples might include a Health Fee (where certain services have an additional cost) and the Stadium Fee (where a sports pass is an additional cost).

Course Fees

Additional fees associated with specific courses. Course fees are not included in this comparison.



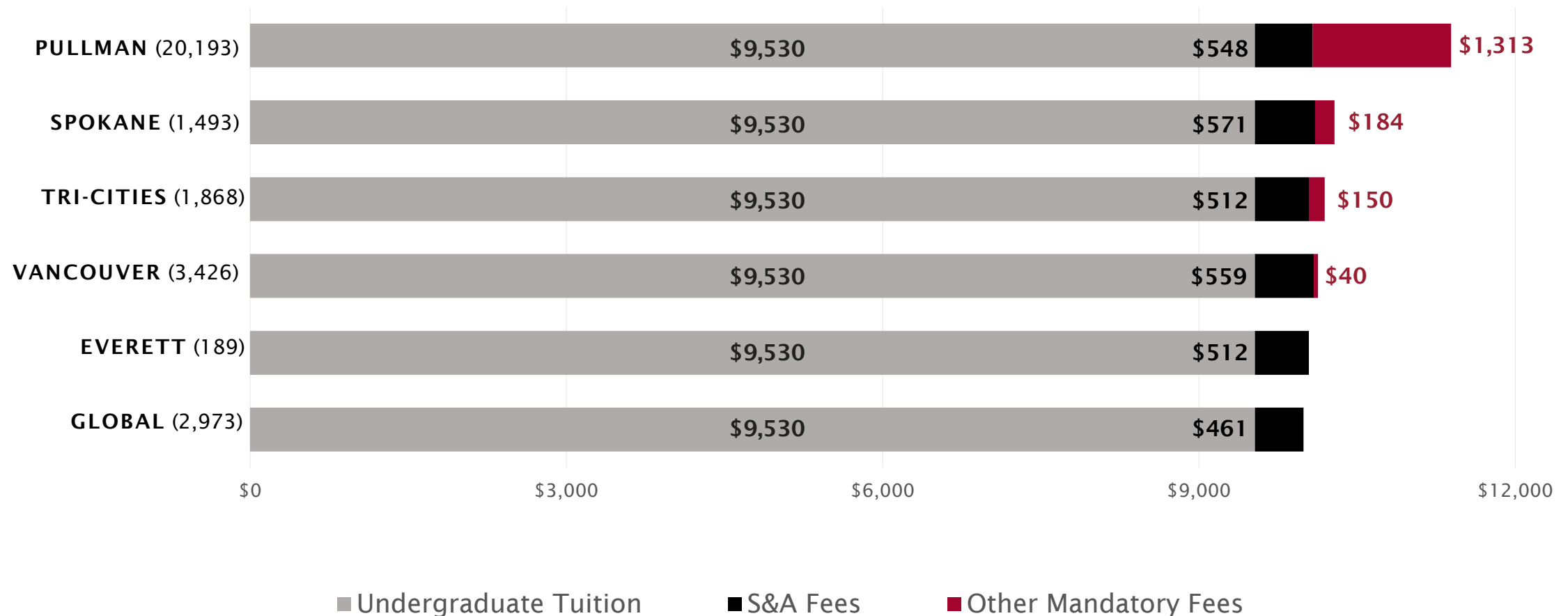

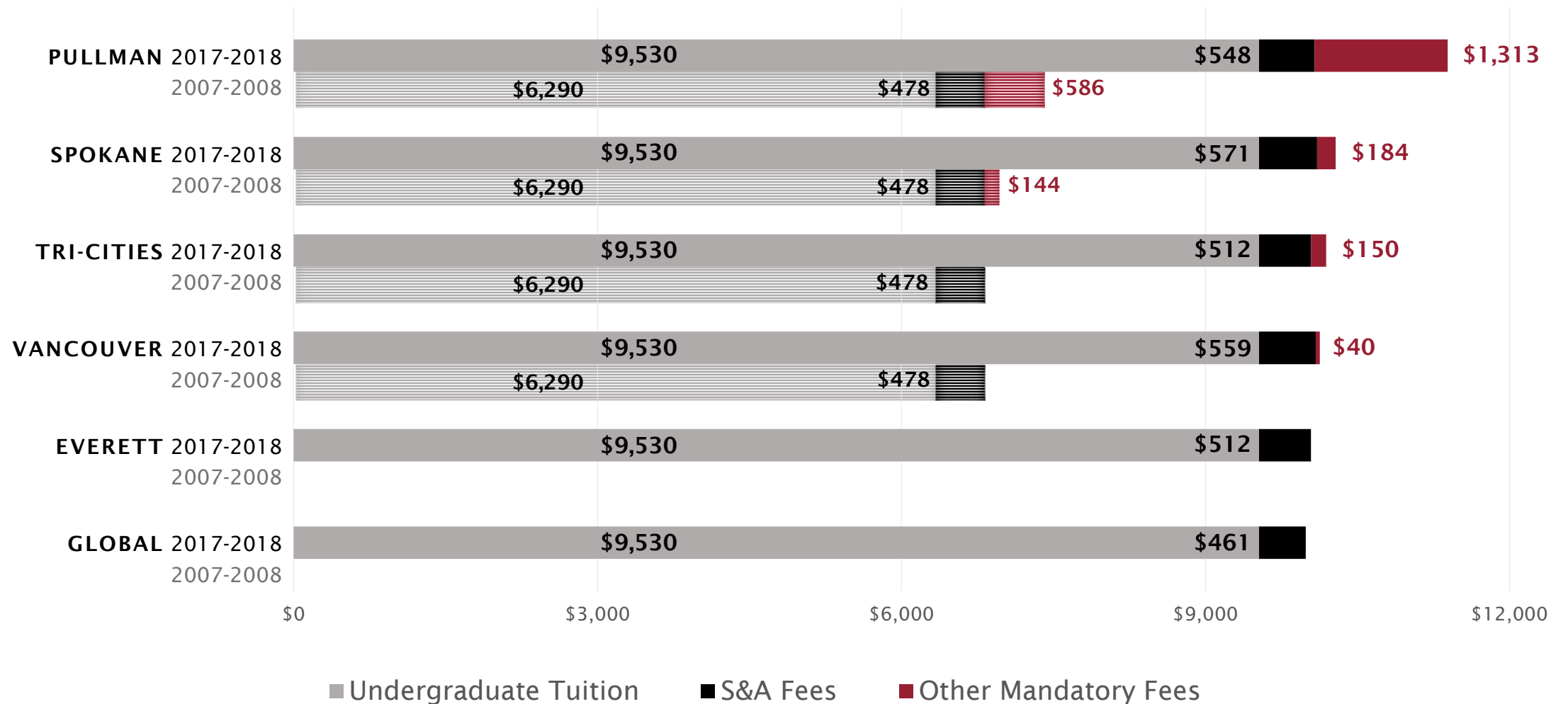
WASHINGTON STATE UNIVERSITY SYSTEM

Tuition & Fees by Campus Location (10 Year Comparison)

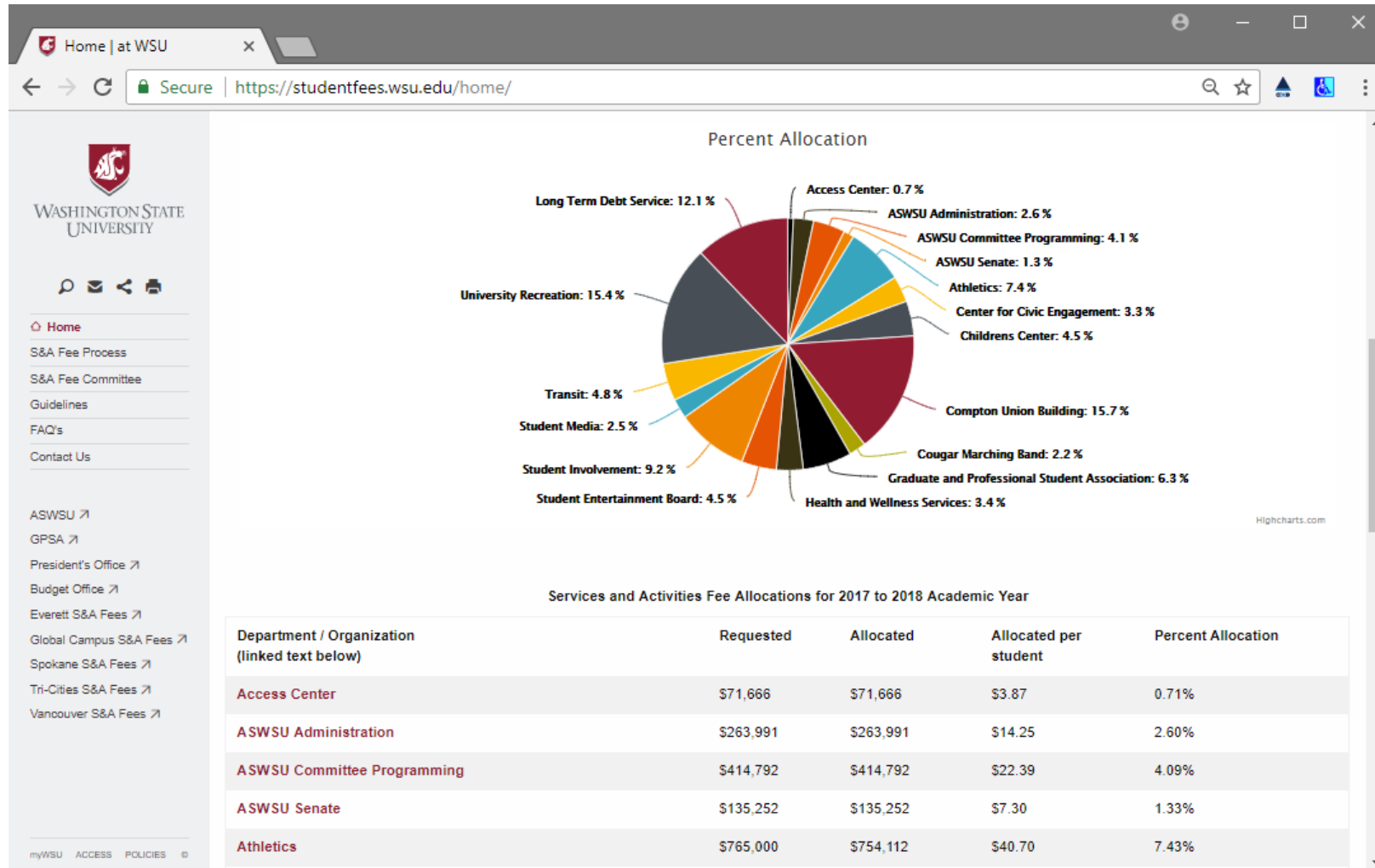

PAC-12 AND PEER SPECIFIC FEE TYPES

- Fees are generally collected for nonacademic student activities and programs such as Health Services, Recreation, Technology, Programming and Events, Transportation, Arts and Cultural, Buildings and Facilities.
- Universities define and administer fees slightly different.
- For this comparison, each University's Services and Activities Fees will be defined as fees collected (but not yet for a specified use) and allocated by a committee that is comprised of mainly students.
- Mandatory fees will be defined as fees that are a set amount and are collected for a specific purpose. These fee amounts are approved by the Board of Regents/Trustees or the Legislature.

Data Notes:

- Comparisons include PAC-12 and the Institutional Effectiveness Council (IEC) PEER list of universities.
- All costs are undergraduate and either full time or calculated for 12 credits if fees are based on credit hours.
- All costs are listed on an annual basis defined as either two semesters or three quarters.
- A few universities set tuition depending on the field of study. In these cases, a "business" major was used for consistency.



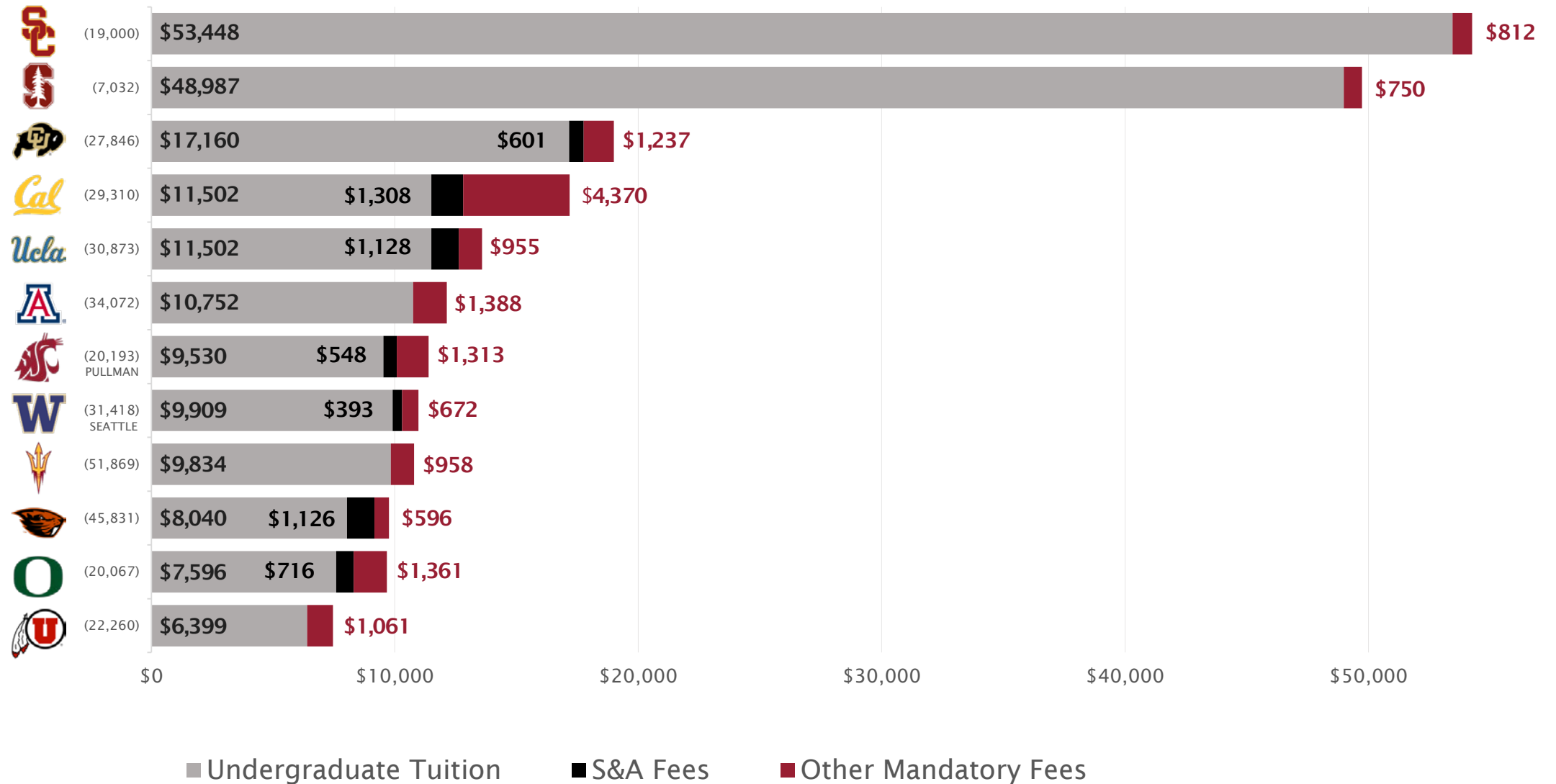

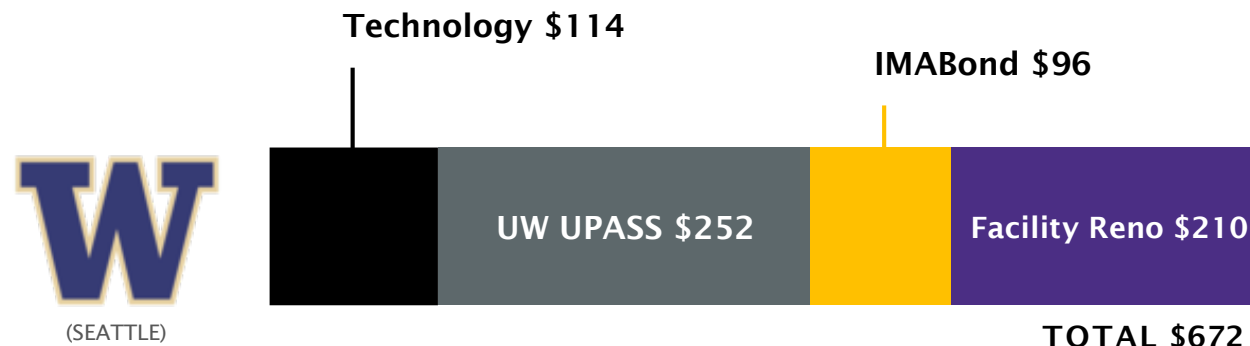
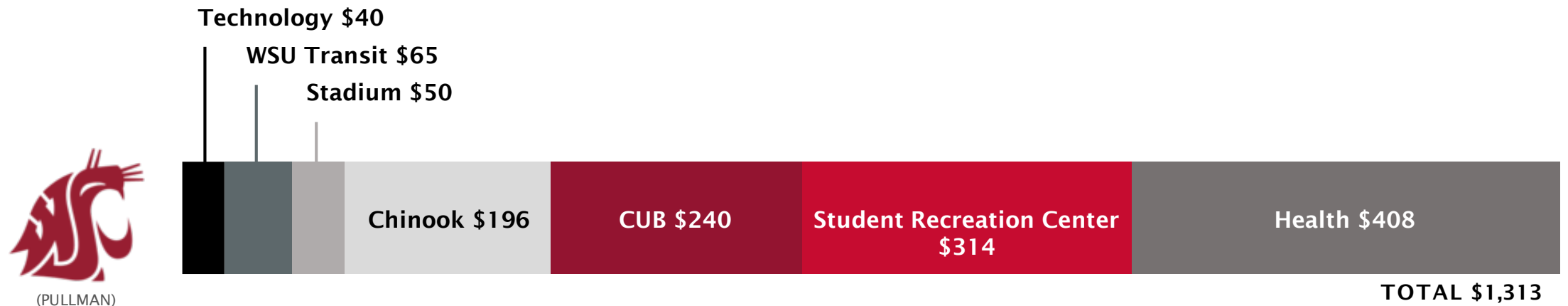
PAC-12 FEE COMPARISON

(2017-2018 Academic Year)



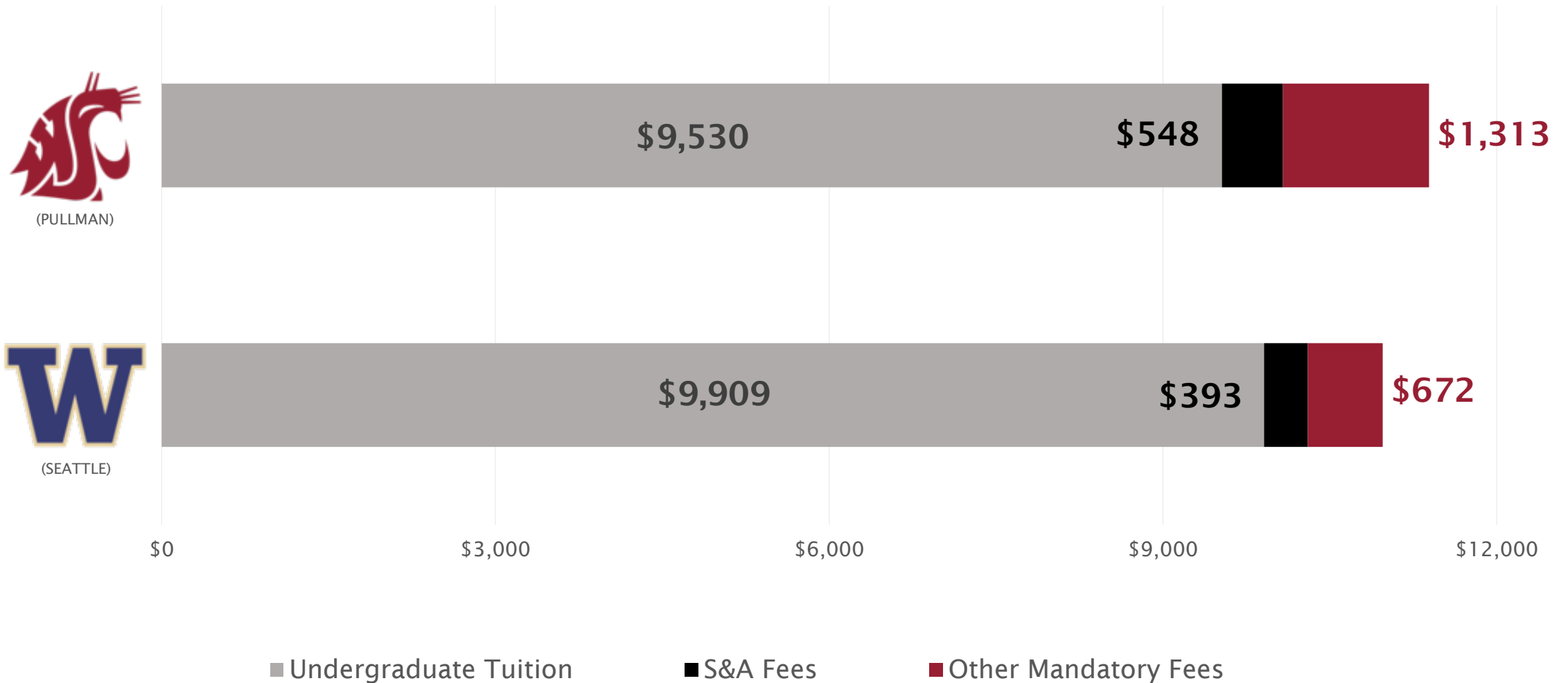
WSU PULLMAN & UW MANDATORY FEES

(2017-2018 Academic Year)



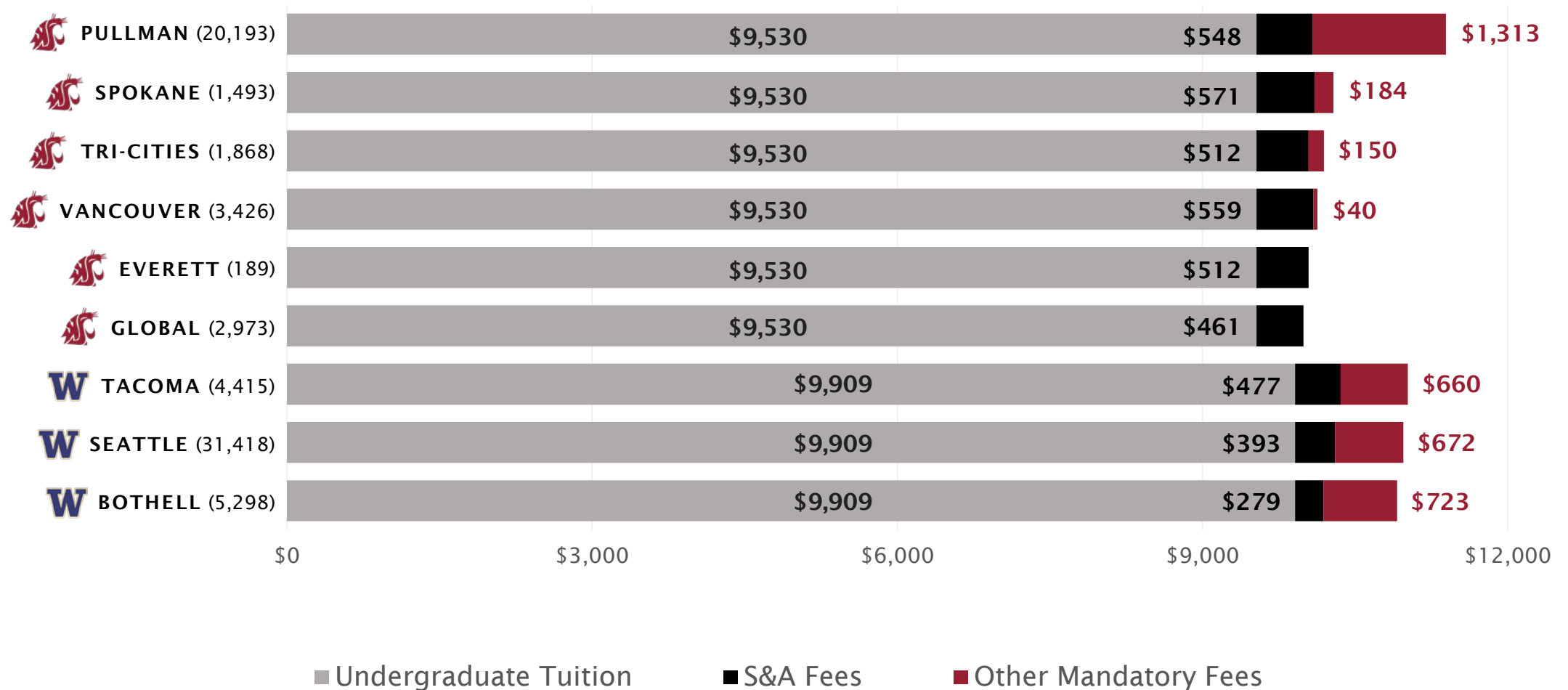
WSU PULLMAN & UW FEE COMPARISON

(2017-2018 Academic Year)



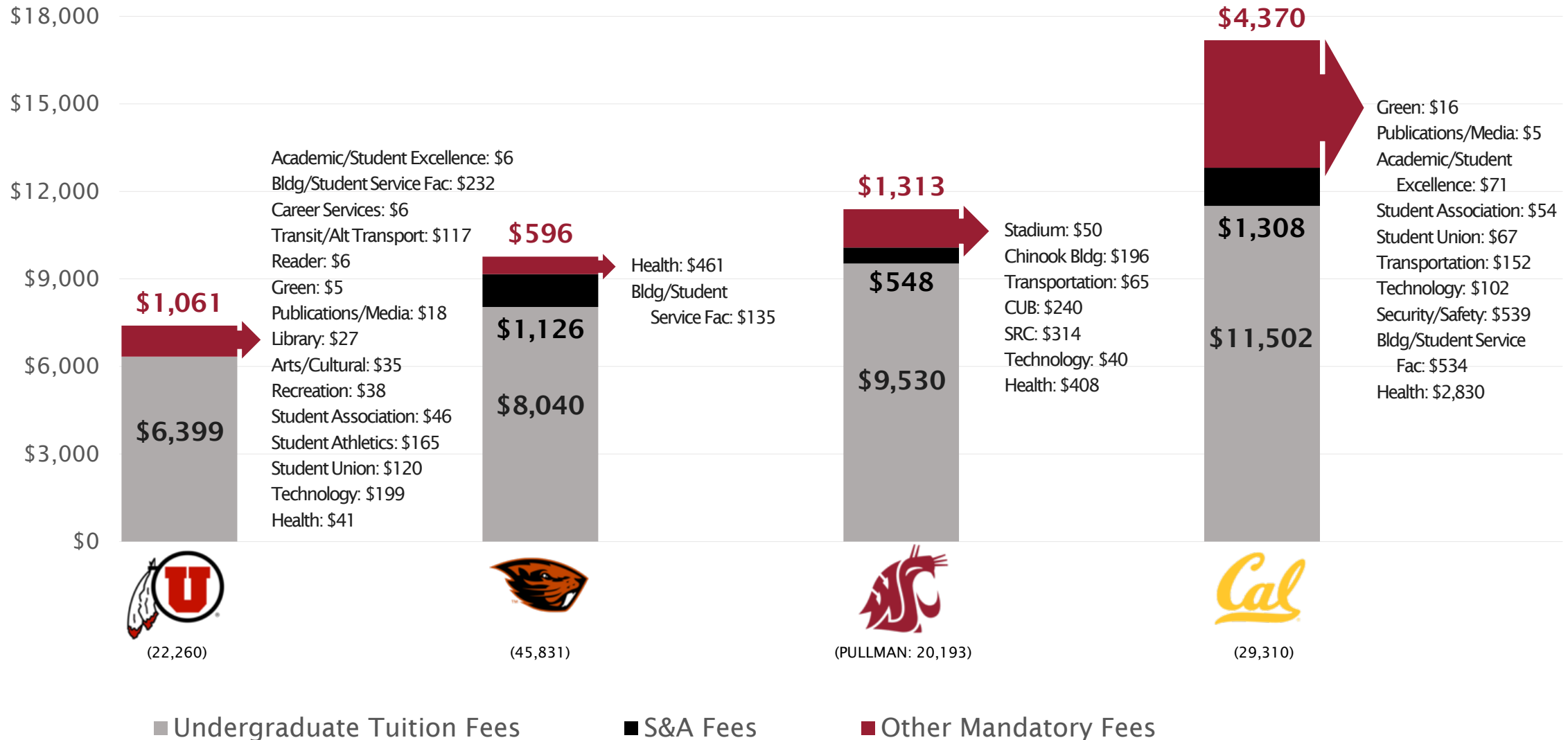
WSU SYSTEM & UW FEE COMPARISON

(2017-2018 Academic Year)



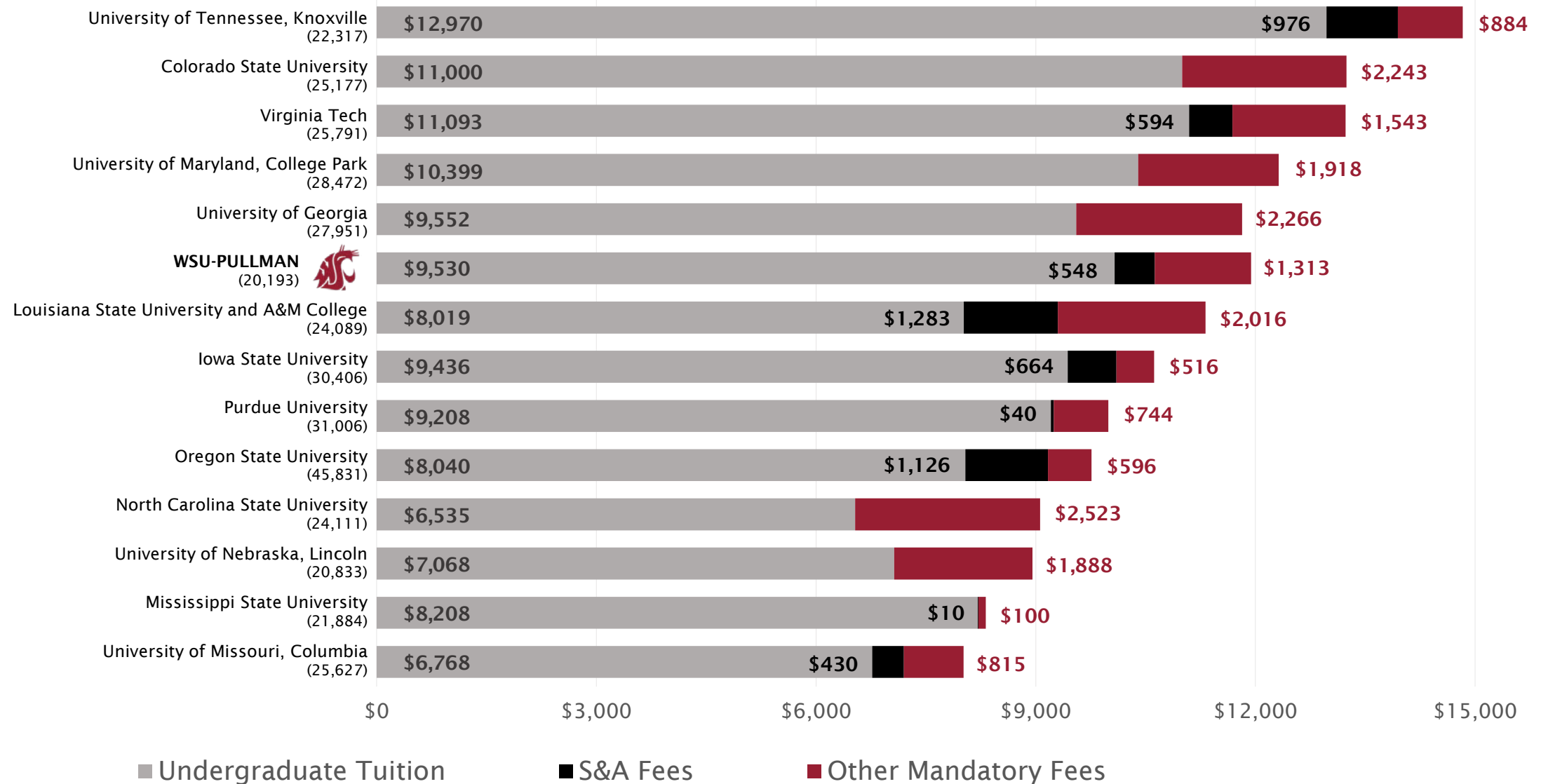
PAC-12 LOW/HIGH COMPARISON
